Volunteer Event Information

Boats and Equipment Requirements

MOVEMENT OF BOATS TO GRAFHAM WATER

In order to prevent the spread of non-native species there is a requirement to ensure that boats are clean before they visit the site using the principle of Check Clean Dry <http://www.nonnativespecies.org/checkcleandry/index.cfm> This includes:

- CHECK your equipment and clothing for live organisms—particularly in areas that are damp or hard to inspect.
- CLEAN and wash equipment, footwear, and clothing thoroughly. If you do come across any organisms, leave them at the water body where you found them.
- DRY all equipment and clothing—some species can live for many days in moist conditions. Make sure you don't transfer water elsewhere.

MOVEMENT OF BOATS FROM GRAFHAM WATER

A non-native species of freshwater shrimp (commonly known as killer shrimps) have been found in Grafham Water and certain restrictions on boat movement have been imposed by AW, DEFRA, or other bodies to prevent the spread of these to other locations in the UK.

These requirements are prominently displayed on the club premises and will include washing boats and equipment before removal from the Club premises. Failure to comply with the requirements of these restrictions may lead to expulsion from the event.

Arriving Boats

When you arrive with a UKWA or support boat on Friday these will need to be stored on the roundabout, which will be closed off and marked out. This will make launching easier on Saturday morning.

Boats can be launched on Friday if the club is open when you arrive. If not Grafham will launch on Saturday morning. They are going to close off the road to the public to allow safe launching.

UKWA only have permission to launch their own ribs on the windsurfing slipway with a banksman present at all times. No other boats to be launched here.

Washing of Boats

All boats MUST be washed on Sunday prior to leaving. There will be jet washers set up on the roundabout to do this.

Boat Drivers

All boat drivers MUST be over the age of 18 and hold a valid RYA Power Boat Level 2 certificate.

Race Office

The race office is located in the UKWA marquee on the far side of the sailing club. A site map is attached.

Orange / Blue course safety boats will need to escort the orange course sailors to and from the racing area to ensure that they don't interfere with club racing / blue or green course racing / so sailors do not sail through the moorings.

Course areas will be discussed at the team meetings with the race office and course safety leader.

Radios

We only have a limited number of radio's available for this event. Please see the attached document which shows the allocation of UKWA radios. All ribs have boat radios.

Each course will have a main radio channel and a spare channel.

- Blue course = 13 (spare channel 72)
- Orange course = 37a (spare channel 72)

Event Schedule

It is very important that all volunteers and coaches attend the briefings that they are required to and that everybody attends the safety briefings. Please make sure that all rescue boats are on the water at the times stated on the schedule.

Racing Schedule

Racing schedules for the day and format's will be discussed with the team each morning at the course team meetings.

Club Activity

There will be club racing and training on both days. Details of club racing will be confirmed in the event management meeting with the sailing club and then passed on during the safety briefings each morning.

The canteen will be open on both Saturday & Sunday. Please be aware that lunchtime in the canteen will be very busy.

Coach & Support Boats

Team leaders, coaches and other support personnel shall stay outside the racing areas (see SI's for definition) where boards are racing from the time of the preparatory signal for the first class to start until all boards have finished or retired or the race committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment.

If the protest committee learns of a possible breach of a rule by a support person through any source, including the Race Committee, it may call a hearing under rule 60.3(d).

Mark Rounding's

Mark rounding's may be done on both courses at marks directed by the course race officer. Mark rounding's to be carried out between the coaches and the course safety boats. Mark rounding's are to be taken in one long list on the sheets provided, there is no need to separate out fleets. These must be accurate.

All paperwork is to be given to the committee boats after each race.

Local Rules:

Fishermen: It is requested that you keep clear of fisherman by 50 meters. There is no requirement for them move and they have equal water rights to us.

Please be courteous to all other recreational water users.

Flags	Grafham Water Sailing Club flag roll (these will need to be returned to the shed at the end of the event) UKWA Team15 class flags (these will need to be returned to the event office at the end of the event)
Boat identification flags	UKWA orange boat identification flags (these will need to be returned to the event office at the end of the event)
